She was born in 1899 in the Ukraine and died in 1988 in New York City. She was a prominent American sculptor who made large “monochromatic” sculptures.

“Monochromatic”

Monochromatic means one color scheme. In Louise Nevelson’s case, that was work which was primarily all black or all white.

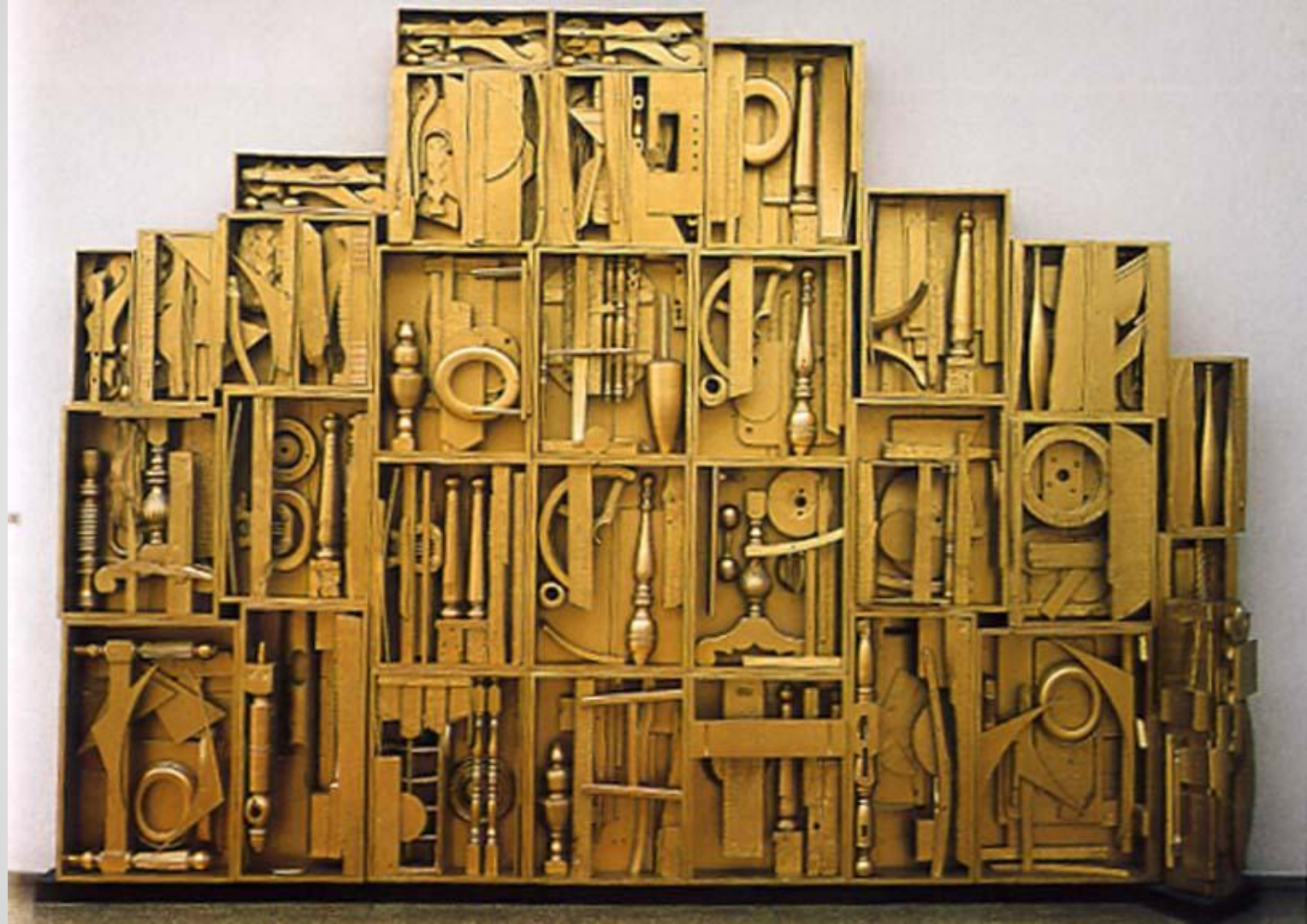
Our Job Today

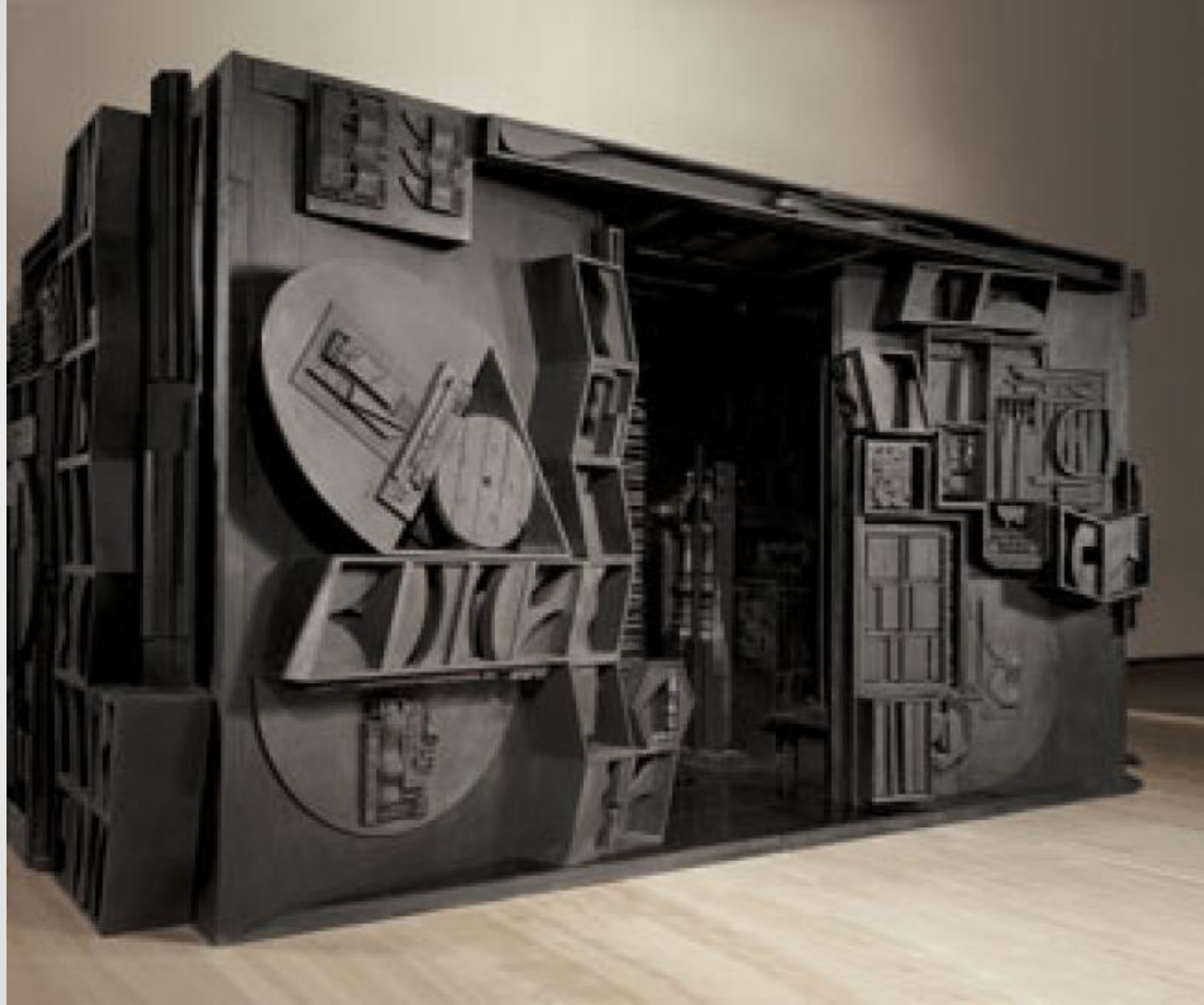


Our Job Today
